

Overview of courses adapted using LOUIS

Below is a list of courses that were adapted using LOUIS. Adaptation means that the course has been adapted with more explicit focus on learning outcomes beyond subject expertise than before – using the LOUIS approach¹. Adaptation make consist literal use of the texts from the LOUIS framework. It may consist of adapting the texts to the context and purpose of the course in question. If no course name is given, it means that the whole degree programme has been adjusted to integrate horizontal competences. If no programme of studies is mentioned, the course can be taken in the context of several degree programmes. A degree level may be indicated.

NB In the overview, only the competence is listed, not the competence dimension (or sub-competence). Courses with the same competence may focus on a different competence dimension, and/or identify a different descriptor as the required learning outcome.
