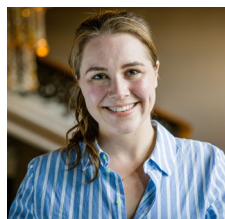

THE EROSION OF TRUST IN ACADEMIA? RESPONSES FROM UNIVERSITIES AND RESEARCH ORGANIZATIONS IN EUROPE

The opening plenary session takes up whether and how public trust in academia is eroding, and what universities and research organisations can do to build and enhance trust in science. The plenary aims to locate the source of distrust in science and to explore solutions through improving science communication, promoting academic freedom and science diplomacy through international cooperation and social impact. 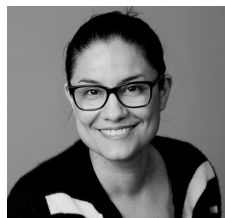

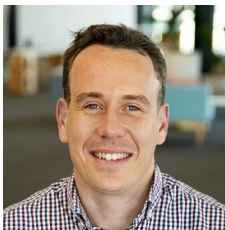

INNOPRENEURSHIP – FROM PEER REVIEW TO REVENUE

This 90-minute panel discussion explores the journey of transforming academic research and theoretical ‘papers’ into viable, revenue-generating ‘ventures’.

Chaired by Dr. Tomasz Waliczko (Aurora Alliance Coordinator), the session brings together a diverse group of experts – ranging from deep-tech professors to serial entrepreneurs – to bridge the gap between lab-bench innovation and market impact. The conversation is structured into three thematic rounds:

- Paper: focusing on the academic foundations, patenting and the integration of sustainability metrics during the research phase
- Revenue: addressing the challenges of scaling, productising prototypes and balancing social missions with financial viability
- Synergy: a collaborative reflection on how the relationship between universities and investors can be optimised to accelerate the ‘lab-to-market’ pipeline

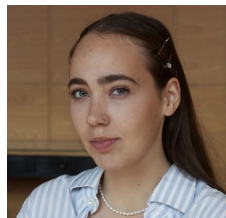
WINDOW INTO STUDENT REPRESENTATION

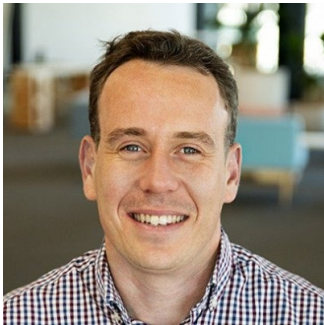

Following his PhD in Geography at the University of Marburg (Germany), Jan Marco Müller's early career included management positions at environmental research centres in Germany, Italy and the UK. After being an Assistant to the Director-General of the Joint Research Centre (JRC; 2009–2012), he managed the office of Dame Anne Glover, the first Chief Scientific Adviser to the President of the European Commission (2012–2015), and then helped set up the Commission's current Scientific Advice Mechanism. From 2017 to 2020, he worked for the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) as Coordinator for Science Diplomacy and acting Chief Operations Officer. From 2020 to 2022, he served as Science & Technology Advisor of the European External Action Service (EEAS), before joining the European Commission's DG Research and Innovation, where he coordinates the development of a European Framework for Science Diplomacy. He is a Fellow of the International Science Council and currently chairs the global Foreign Ministries Science & Technology Advice Network (FMSTAN).

Dr. Mai Thi Nguyen-Kim



Dr. Mai Thi Nguyen-Kim is the holder of a doctorate in chemistry as well as a science journalist and author. She initially gained popularity in 2020 through her mailab channel (produced by funk, the German public broadcasters' network for youths). That year, her video 'Corona geht gerade erst los' (Covid is just getting started) was the most viewed YouTube video in Germany. Now numbering over 1.5 million subscribers, the YouTube channel has been renamed MAITHINK X and features topical videos to accompany her science programme MAITHINK X – Die Show, which has been running on the German TV channel ZDFneo since 2021. This year, her show won the Grimme-Preis, Germany's most prestigious media award, in the entertainment category.

She hosted the TV show Quarks on the WDR channel from 2018 to 2021 before moving to the ZDF network where, in addition to her own show, she appears regularly in the Terra X documentaries. Her recent projects include documentaries entitled Vietnam and Chemie des Kochens (the chemistry of cooking), available for streaming on ZDF. While Vietnam explores the country from a variety of perspectives, Chemie des Kochens focuses on the interplay between science and cooking.

Dr. Mai Thi Nguyen-Kim

Mai Thi Nguyen-Kim also presented the third season (following a 12-year hiatus) of Nicht nachmachen! (Don't try this at home!) together with Lutz van der Horst and Fabian Köster, carrying out dangerous experiments in four new episodes.

After the publication of her book Die kleinste gemeinsame Wirklichkeit (the smallest common reality), published by Droemer Knauer, the fourth book in her children's series BIBIBIBER HAT DA MAL 'NE FRAGE (Bibibiber has a question), published by Oetinger Verlag, came out in October 2025. In this innovative non-fiction series for children, she and author Marie Meimberg take the whole family into a world where science is explored in an exciting way. This series is also available as audiobooks with soundtracks.

Her work has earned her numerous awards (including the Hanns-Joachim-Friedrichs-Preis, the Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany, the Grimme-Preis and the Nannen-Preis). Mai Thi Nguyen-Kim also plays an active role in various scientific institutions, currently serving on the Senate of the Max Planck Society, the advisory board of the Deutsche Telekom Stiftung foundation and the supervisory board of the Science Media Center Germany gGmbH.

is co-founder of paged, a social-tech startup fostering inclusion of neurodiverse people in the digital space. During her studies she was involved in various research projects in the area of cognitive science, e.g. at University of California, Berkeley and New York University. With this background, she now devotes all her passion to paged, developing different AI and tech solutions to enable companies to make their digital content more accessible to neurodiverse people.
